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Summary of 2024 Kansas Health Care Legislation

The Kansas Legislature concluded its work Wednesday, May 1, passing 158 bills. With a tax plan passed in the last few hours of the regular session, Governor Laura Kelly vetoed the final tax package and sought to call the legislature back for a special session on June 18, 2024. The two-day session included the passage of just 2 bills. Policymakers in both the House and Senate are up for election this year, and the new biennium is slated to begin Jan. 13, 2025. This issue brief summarizes enacted legislation, including those affecting hospitals and the health care industry, and legislation that was not completed during the 2024 session.

LEGISLATION PASSED DURING THE 2024 SESSION

Budget And Appropriations

- Appropriations Legislation for FY 23, 24, 25, 26, 27 and 28 for various state agencies. (SB 28)
 - Contains \$50 million for increasing Medicaid Outpatient Hospital reimbursements by 31% and \$30 million for increasing Medicaid physician provider codes by 9%.
 - \$18 million to continue add-on Medicaid payments to nursing facilities.
 - Carryover of the unused \$5 million to reimburse the costs of health care providers, law
 enforcement and counties on an hourly basis for patient observation and transportation
 following an evaluation and awaiting approval for in-state involuntary state hospital
 admission.
 - Added \$5 million for hospitals with adult behavioral health beds.
 - \$2 million for hospitals operating as Rural Emergency Hospitals that haven't been eligible.
 - \$5.6 million was added for the cost adjustment factor for Critical Access Hospitals.
 - Added language directing Kansas Department of Health and Environment to begin the process of increasing the hospital provider assessment from no lower than 5% up to 6%.
 - Added language requiring supplemental nurse staffing agencies to register annually with the Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services and report quarterly to the agency.
 - Added language saying drug manufacturers must honor the 340B Drug Pricing Program at contract pharmacies through the Consumer Protection Act.
 - \$15 million for the Western Kansas Nursing Initiative at Fort Hays State University.
- Omnibus Appropriations bill for FY 23, 24, and 25. (<u>HB 2551</u>)
