Senate Public Health and Welfare Committee Hears Bill Limiting Local and State Powers

Today the Senate Public Health and Welfare Committee, chaired by Senator Beverly Gossage (R-Eudora), met to hold a hearing on <u>Senate Bill 391</u> - Enacting the constitutional right to health freedom act to regulate the activities of the secretary of health and environment related to public health functions; repealing statutes relating to the secretary's authority to quarantine individuals and impose associated penalties.

House Health and Human Services Committee Hears Bills

Today, the House Health and Human Services Committee, chaired by Representative Brenda Landwehr (R-Wichita) met to hold hearings on two bills.

<u>House Bill 2784</u>, transferring authority of certification of continuing care retirement communities from the Kansas insurance department to the Kansas department of aging and disability services and lowering the nursing facility provider assessment for continuing care retirement communities.
