The <u>Kansas Hospital Association Bill Tracker</u> is designed to keep you up-to-date on current legislation. KHA will update and share this document weekly while the legislators are in session.

#### **Introduction of Bills**

<u>Senate Bill 14</u> by Committee on Ways and Means – Concerning the state budget; providing for a continuous budget until amended, lapsed or eliminated by the legislature; temporary reallocations

<u>Senate Bill 16</u> by Committee on Federal and State Affairs – Concerning financial services; prohibiting discrimination by financial services companies based on social credit scorez; requiring registered investment advisers to obtain written consent from clients before investing client money in mutual funds, equity funds, companies and financial institutions that engage in ideological boycotts

<u>Senate Bill 19</u> by Committee on Public Health and Welfare – Concerning public health; relating to medical care; enacting the Conscientious Right to Refuse Act; prohibiting discrimination against individuals who refuse certain medical interventions and creating a civil cause of action against entities who discriminate based upon such medical care refusal; revoking the authority of the secretary of the Kansas Department of Health and Environment to order individuals to isolate or quarantine and impose penalties for violations thereof

<u>Senate Bill 23</u> by Committee on Financial Institutions and Insurance – Concerning insurance; relating to unfair and deceptive acts or practices; requiring agents and insurers to respond to inquiries from the commissioner of insurance within 14 calendar days; authorizing certain rebate pilot programs to exceed one year in duration

<u>Senate Bill 25</u> by Committee on Assessment and Taxation – Concerning insurance; relating to property and casualty insurance; enacting the Insurance Savings Account Act; allowing individuals and corporations to establish insurance savings accounts with certain financial institutions; providing eligible expenses, requirements and restrictions for such accounts; requiring the secretary of revenue to adopt certain rules and regulations; granting nonexclusive marketing authority to the state commissioner of insurance; establishing addition and subtraction modifications under the Kansas Income Tax Act

<u>Senate Bill 27</u> by Committee on Financial Institutions and Insurance – Concerning insurance; relating to the powers, duties and responsibilities of the commissioner; eliminating the requirement that the commissioner submit certain reports to the governor; removing certain specific entities from the definition of person for the purpose of enforcing insurance law

<u>House Bill 2015</u> by Committee on Welfare Reform, Requested by Representative Awerkamp – Concerning public assistance; relating to food assistance; directing the secretary for the Kansas Department for Children and Families to request a waiver from the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program that would allow the state to prohibit purchase of candy and soft drinks with food assistance

<u>House Bill 2023</u> by Committee on Elections, Requested by Representative Waggoner – Concerning elections; relating to election crimes; creating the crime of interference with an election official; providing penalties for violations thereof

<u>House Bill 2024</u> by Committee on Taxation, Requested by Representative Hoheisel – Concerning income taxation; enacting the Fighting Chance for Firefighters Act; providing a tax credit for firefighters who incur unreimbursed medical expenses for screening for occupation-related cancer

<u>House Bill 2027</u> by Committee on Welfare Reform, Requested by Representative Awerkamp – Concerning public assistance; reorganizing subsections of the public assistance statute; updating cross-references
