

KHA's Capitol Comments February 21, 2025

Bethell Committee Meets

Today, the Bob Bethell Joint Committee on Home and Community-Based Services and KanCare Oversight met.

The committee first had responses from the fourth quarter of 2024 meeting from the following:

- Evan Dean, associate director, KU Center on Disabilities
- Natalie Daniel, policy director, Unite Us
- Sunflower Health Plan
- Kansas Department of Health and Environment

The committee also had written-only testimony from KanCare stakeholders, including:

- <u>Kylee Childs</u>, LeadingAge Kansas, highlighted managed care organization reconsideration delays and local pharmacy contracting issues.
- Rachelle Colombo, Kansas Medical Society, asked the legislature to direct the Kansas Department of Health and Environment to take steps to develop a second Medicaid fee schedule for MCOs for services provided within the KanCare program.
- Marissa Alcantar, Alliance for a Healthy Kansas, highlighted the need for Medicaid expansion.
- <u>Kim Cook</u>, Numotion, highlighted the need to reform prior authorizations for wheelchair repair.
- <u>Tanya Dorf Brunner</u>, Oral Health Kansas, highlighted the need for increases in Medicaid dental rates.
- <u>Matt Fletcher</u>, InterHab, highlighted the additional need for stakeholder engagement and conflict of interest concerns.
- JD Kemp, LifeStreams, highlighted Sunflower Health Plan's work on the Brian Injury Waiver services.
- <u>Scott Lopez</u>, Alliance Rehab and Medical Equipment, highlighted the Kansas Medical Assistance Program as a secondary payer, difficulty accessing the federal program, problems with the appeals process following denials, and non-contracts with HealthyBlue.
- <u>Nicole McLain</u>, Little Stars Therapy Services, emphasized audit practices with MCOs that create financial challenges.

- <u>Gabrielle Meadows</u>, Thrive Therapy of Kansas, requested coverage for community support teams services.
- And several private citizens.

The committee next heard presentations by <u>Haely Ordoyne</u>, long-term care ombudsman, <u>Steven Anderson</u>, Medicaid inspector general and <u>Janet Williams</u>, MindsMatter.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, <u>Christine Osterlund</u>, deputy secretary of Agency Integration and Kansas Medicaid director, gave a presentation on quarterly updates that highlighted the following topics:

- KanCare 3.0
- KDHE Medicaid Rate Study
- Performance Metrics
- MCO Financial Review
- Eligibility Updates

Next, the Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services gave <u>presentations</u>, including the following:

- Secretary Laura Howard reviewed the legislative agenda, Home and Community-Based Services Waivers, and grants.
- Scott Brunner gave an overview of the construction of the South Central Regional Mental Health Center, which is scheduled to start this month.
- Lacey Hunter gave an overview of staffing agency oversight and federal staffing mandates.
- Andy Brown gave an overview of Behavioral Health services.

Last, the committee heard from the managed care organizations, including the following:

- Sunflower Health Plan
- <u>UnitedHealthcare Community Plan of Kansas</u>
- Health Blue Kansas

The committee will meet again next quarter.

Kansas Fights Addiction Grant Review Board Meeting

Today, the Kansas Fights Addiction Grant Review Board met. The committee heard from staff about updates on the Purdue Pharma case and more on annual reports and utilization.

Staff also highlighted <u>House Bill 2159</u>, and if passed, could increase needs related to naloxone expenditures. Staff reported that 9,000 Naloxone kits per year have been previously approved.

The committee heard there will be a one-day conference for municipalities to educate them on utilizing Kansas Fights Addiction Grant Funds. The conference will be on April 18 in Overland Park with approximately 70-80 participants. The attorney general's office requested a grant to cover food expenditures for the conference, which was approved.

Staff informed the group that the needs assessment update would be presented to the board in April. Public comment plans are still in development.

For RFP 1, 16 were closed and have final payments.

For RFP 2, nine were approved and closed, and about \$433,000 remained in payments for those who had requested extensions.

For RFP 3, and four all grants have been initiated.

The committee discussed legislative requests and approved the annual report.

The committee heard updates from the following:

- Jennifer Wilson, director of Crisis Services Comcare of Sedgwick County

The committee will meet again on March 14.

Next Week's Schedule

Following the Friday turnaround deadline, the legislature will take Monday off but return to committee hearings on Tuesday. The turnaround deadline suggests that those bills, not exempt from legislative deadlines, must be passed by their chamber of origin.

There are many reasons a bill may be exempt from those legislative deadlines, including:

- The bill was introduced in an exempt committee
- The bill was re-referred to an exempt committee at some point ahead of the turnaround deadline.
