Buttelli Appointed KCMHC President

KANSAS CITY — Phil Buttelli, President and CEO of Menorah Medical Center, was appointed a one-year term as president of the Kansas City Metropolitan Healthcare Council, the regional office of the Kansas and Missouri Hospital Associations. His term began Jan. 1.

“It is truly an honor to lead the efforts of the Kansas City Metropolitan Healthcare Council as we position the greater Kansas City region as a premier destination for quality, compassionate health care services,” says Phil Buttelli, Menorah Medical Center Chief Operating Officer. “I am thrilled to collaborate with bi-state hospital leaders and colleagues to support the healthcare industry and collaborate on best practices.”
