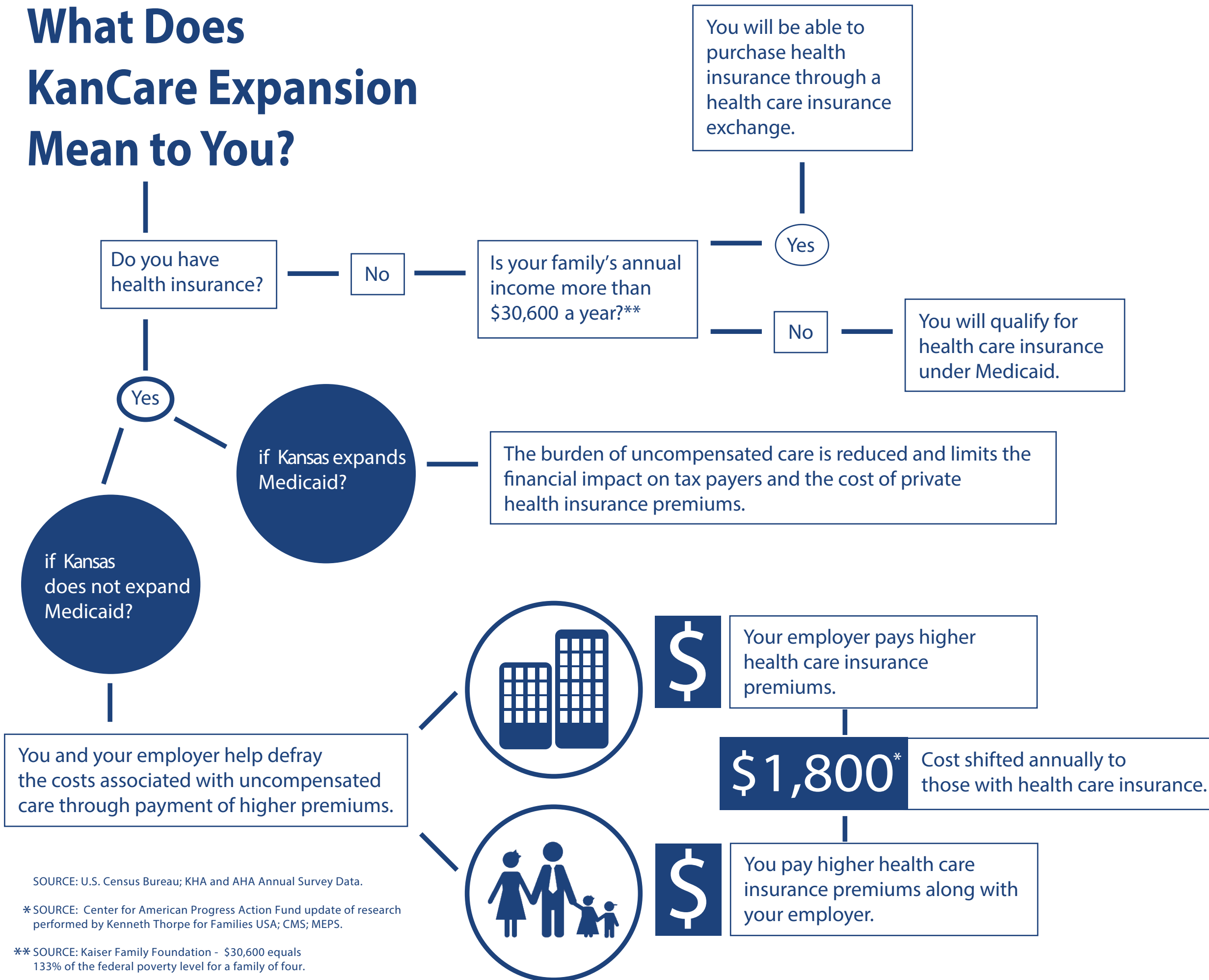


What Does KanCare Expansion Mean to You?



Increasing Coverage Stems Costs for Everyone

Congress and the President have reduced the amount the federal government reimburses Kansas hospitals to care for Medicare patients by \$1.3 billion over the next 10 years.

These cuts have afforded the federal government to offer support to states to expand health coverage to many people who presently are uninsured.
