De-escalation Techniques: How to Approach Volatile Behavior in Health Care

Health care staff face significant risks when it comes to workplace violence. Many factors contribute to these risks including working directly with those who have a history of violent behavior, behavioral health issues or are under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol. The rate of serious workplace violence incidents is more than five times greater in health care settings than in private industry, according to the General Accounting Office's 2016 report.

Join the Kansas Hospital Association for an educational webinar at noon on Tuesday, July 9, when Tanner Funk, DNP, RN, The University of Kansas Health System, will share his experience in addressing workplace violence. This webinar will focus on how staff can best implement de-escalation techniques, review core CPI principles and techniques and review patient care scenarios. Funk will review the fundamental components of assessing for signs of escalation, the critical importance of providing proactive interventions and how we can best utilize verbal de-escalation techniques.

Funk graduated with his Bachelor of Science in nursing from The University of Kansas in 2004 and began his career in nursing on an addiction recovery intensive care unit. He earned his Master of Science in nursing from the Research College of Nursing in 2008. He is an education specialist at The University of Kansas Health System in Kansas City, Kansas. He is currently the lead facilitator of the mental health training program, mental health fellowship program and trauma informed care program at this health system. He is also an adjunct assistant professor of nursing at The University of Kansas School of Nursing where he is a mental health clinical instructor and teaches both leadership and capstone nursing courses. Tanner completed his Doctor of Nursing Practice in 2020.
