Sex and Gender Issues in Pain Management

The rate of increase in the number of women presenting to hospitals due to an opioid overdose is significantly higher than men. Is gender a contributing factor? Join us for a webinar on Sept. 27, when Kim Templeton, MD, University of Kansas Medical Center, Kansas City, will discuss how women perceive pain and respond to opioids differently than men. In addition, she will share specific issues for women of childbearing age. The target audience for this offering is clinicians, pharmacists, quality professionals and hospital leaders.

Templeton, MD, FAAOS, FAOA, FAMWA is professor of orthopedic surgery and associate dean for continuing medical education at the University of Kansas Medical Center in Kansas City, Kansas. She is also vice-chair for faculty development in the Department of Orthopedic Surgery and Sports Medicine. Dr. Templeton is past-president of the Kansas Orthopedic Society, the Mid-Central States Orthopedic Society, the U.S. Bone and Joint Initiative, and the American Medical Women's Association. Dr. Templeton recently completed her term on the National Institutes of Health Advisory Committee on Research on Women's Health.
